



2018 - 2019 URC Award Call for Proposals

The University Research Committee announces the annual Call for Proposals for the 2018-2019 funding cycle in the following categories:

- Regular URC
- URC-GaCTSA (Georgia Clinical and Translational Science Alliance)
- URC-Halle Institute for Global Research and Learning International Research Awards

Applications are welcome from all regular, **full-time** Emory faculty members, regardless of rank. For eligibility details see <http://urc.emory.edu/grants/urc/faq.html>.

Proposals should be submitted under one of the following application categories:

Biological and Health Sciences: Regular or GaCTSA (ACTSI)
Humanities
Math & Natural Sciences
Social Sciences
Visual and Performing Arts
Interdisciplinary

The maximum award in each category (with the exception of Interdisciplinary) is \$30,000 per application. For the Interdisciplinary category, the maximum award is \$40,000.

Most proposals will have one principal investigator. Biological/Health Science proposals considered under the ACTSI (GaCTSA) funding category must have only one principal investigator. Proposals submitted under the “Interdisciplinary” category must have more than one principal investigator.
